

# COMMUNITY OUTREACH REPRESENTATIVES

Community Outreach Representatives work closely with the Community Relations Team to increase public awareness about Hospice by generating potential contacts, staffing information tables, and/or providing informative presentations on various end-of-life topics.

A variety of volunteer opportunities exist, such as:

- Contacting community groups to promote and schedule free education presentations
- Inputting assembled information onto a community relations database
- Representing Hospice of the Western Reserve at community health fairs
- Giving 5-minute hospice overviews for United Way campaigns
- Presenting longer presentations as requested by community groups
- Conducting follow-up calls/surveys following educational presentations
- Delivering literature/brochures to libraries, senior centers, etc.

Community Outreach Representatives are needed to help communicate the hospice mission to community organizations, faith institutions and area businesses.

- Interest in dispelling common myths about hospice
- Willingness to talk to others about the importance of hospice
- Commitment to addressing the end-of-life needs of your community
- Willingness to attend a two-hour training session
- Concern for the well being of friends and neighbors
